

President George Washington proclaimed November 26, 1789, as a national day of Thanksgiving . Nowadays, Thanksgiving is one of the most important and widely celebrated holidays in the United States. In addition to the traditional dinner, families and friends gather, watch parades, play football games, and express gratitude for the blessings received. It also marks the beginning of the holiday season in the country.



Day of the Dead

Day of the Dead is a two-day holiday that reunites the living and dead. It is celebrated on November 1st and 2nd. Families create offerings to honor their departed family members that have passed. These altars are decorated with bright yellow marigold flowers, photos of the departed, and the favorite foods and drinks of the one being honored. The offerings are believed to encourage visits from the land of the dead as the departed souls hear their prayers, smell their foods and join in the celebrations!


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


